March 5, 2023 2nd Sunday of Lent

Please check the inside of this bulletin for information on Lenten services and practices.

It is one of the precepts of the Church to go to confession at least once a year. Please take the advantage to seek forgiveness of sin through this sacrament especially in the Lenten Season.

For the Lenten Season this year at the weekend Masses, there will be no Opening Hymn. When the bell rings, please stand in silence as the procession comes into the sanctuary and Mass begins with the Sign of the Cross. The penitential rite will be form A with the Confiteor. The Kyrie, Eleison will be sung or recited at the five Sundays in Lent not including Palm Sunday. Please follow the lead of the celebrant, deacon or cantor.

Beginning with Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday, the sign of peace will be offered again. You are welcomed to extend a handshake or words expressing peace to those standing near you.

The pastoral council desires to have elections as stated in the diocesan directives on councils. According to the guidelines in these directives, two-thirds of the positions should be filled by election with the remaining one-third appointed by the pastor. The Holy Family pastoral council has seven positions. Three positions will be open this year for election. There should be six people running. The weekend for the elections is set for the weekend of May 6th-7th.

The pastoral council is one of two councils that parishes are to have with the other being the finance council. The pastoral council concerns itself with aspects of the parish except finances and temporal goods which are under the domain of the finance council. A person who can be placed on the slate is to be a registered member of the parish, supports the work of the Church and parish, and will work together for the parish and not for oneself or one issue. One who is interested in being in the upcoming election must put it in writing and submit it to Msgr. Stoetzel by March 15th.
