A lot has been packed into this weekend

The Feast of the Immaculate Conception on Saturday

And the Second Sunday of Advent the next day

But isn't that what life is mostly like?

We seldom have the chance to space things out according to our liking More likely, things are packed right on top of each other

And we deal with it

Advent is hopefully a time to take a step back

Even in the midst of all the holiday business

To look at our relationship with God

To see it as it is

And to see if we are making the right choices

To ask ourselves: is my relationship with God where I want it to be?

Awhile back I was reading a story about Jack Nicklaus

One of the greatest golfers of all time

What really set him apart was his mental ability

His ability to concentrate

One hot June day

He was playing in the US Open

He hit into the rough

Addressing the ball

He stood there

Then backing out

He said 'That's the wrong swing'

But he never even swung the club

Being caught on tape

Nicklaus confused a lot of people that day

But he explained it in his book

Before every shot

He went through a mental rehearsal

First, he would see the ball where he intended it to stop

Then he backs up

He sees the ball land and how it spins

He sees it in flight

Then he sees the type of swing needed to produce that result

So the swing that was wrong

Was a swing in his mind

He was able to then make his adjustments

And make the right swing

This mental rehearsal is our Advent

We have a time each year to see our relationship with God

We want to be right there, next to him

So we step back

If that is where I want to be

Is my life on the right trajectory to get there?

Do I have the right spin on my life?

Am I moving in the right direction?

What about my address?

Am I lined up right?

What about the swing?

Am I making the right choices?

Are my actions and words those of a Christian?

Do I need to make swing changes?

Perhaps I have hit a shot into the rough

Venial sin

Or even hit one out of bounds, and have to take a penalty stroke

Mortal sin

Do I need the graces of Reconciliation to get right with God?

Advent is a time to make a mental note of my life

Past

Present

Future

Where I have been

How I got to where I am now

And see where I want to be

When we do this mentally

We see this is the time to make the changes I need

To select the right swing

To prepare my heart

So I can encounter Christ in a brand new way this Christmas

Not just the historical birth of Christ

Not just the Sacramental encounter with him in the Eucharist But most important

Put my life on course for that final encounter

That face to face encounter all of us will one day experience

To get where we want to be

We have to see reality

The world is against us

Just as it was against John

Look at those stacked up against him in our Gospel

Many of the same ones that will be against Christ

Caesar, Pontius Pilate

Herod and his brother Philip

Lysanias, Annas and Caiaphas

John saw his path

It was not an easy path

But a path that led to Christ

He desired to follow that path

He desired to show that path to others

So he became the voice of one

Crying out in the desert

Making the path straight

Filling in valleys and leveling mountains

For one purpose

Salvation

If we fail in the world's sight

So did Jesus, John and all the Apostles

Pretty good company

But if we fail in God's sight, the company is not so great

There are eternal repercussions for our actions in this life

We can use games as analogies for life

But life is not a game

Our life here sets the course for our eternity

Advent gives us an opportunity to ask yourself

What will that eternity be like?
