**Today we look at prophets** 

They were a big deal back in O T times

Many of the people we read about in SS were prophets

Isaiah, Elisha, Elijah Samuel, Jeremiah, Daniel

Miriam and Deborah

These and so many more were sent by God

They were God's messengers

To those of their own generation

To future generations

They were not fortune tellers

They would speak of the past, the present and the future

But always with one purpose

Calling His people back to God

To repentance

Warning them

Often at great personal danger

Sometimes the danger came from those they were sent to

Many were attacked or killed

At other times, the prophets paid the price with the people of God

And they were imprisoned or sent into exile with them

All because they were speaking the truth

Then there were false prophets

Telling the kings and the people what they wanted to hear

**Telling them God was pleased with their lives** 

Telling them God would bless their decisions

Doing these things for money or power

And the people would believe them

There was a clear difference between a real and a false prophet

If what they claimed was God's word came to pass

They were a true prophet

But by the time it came to pass

The consequences were already in place

The time for conversion

The time to return to walking in God's ways were over

And the people had to live with their choices

Ezekiel was one of the major prophets

Son of man

This term means human being

In Hebrew, this is not the same term used in reference to Jesus

I am sending you to the Israelites

Ezekiel did not choose this role

He has been given a mission

Rebels who have rebelled

Hard of face

Obstinate of heart

Not a group most would volunteer to speak with You shall say to them...

We are not told what he was to tell them

Only that when it came to pass

They would know a prophet had been among them

And there is no guarantee the people will listen

In fact it is inferred they will not

But Ezekiel is not called to be successful in the eyes of the world

His calling is to be faithful to God

Then we come to Paul

He has been given special revelations

But not for his own glory

But so he can bring the Word of God to the Gentiles

And to keep him from becoming too self-important

He is given a thorn in the side

Whether this thorn was a physical ailment

Or a rebellious group of people

We are not sure

But in either case, it keeps him from becoming too exalted

And Paul did not just accept this

He called out 3 times for relief

The relief he got was not what he expected

Power is made perfect in weakness

God did not want Paul to rely on his own strength

He did not want Paul to rely on his own abilities

**Humbled by his affliction** 

Humbled by his ineffectiveness on his own

Paul turns to God for help

He turns to God for strength

In the mystery of Christ

When in his passion and death he was weakest

This was his greatest moment of strength

**Now for Paul** 

In his weakness, bearing insults, persecutions and constraints

He is strong in the power of Christ

This is one of the many contradictions in the mystery of our faith

Then in our Gospel

We have Jesus returning home

He goes to the synagogue on the Sabbath to teach

Something quite normal in those days

The people were astonished at his teaching

But their astonishment was not in awe of his works

It was opposite

They resented his teaching

Who does he think he is?

Isn't this Mary's son?

The carpenter?

Didn't he grow up here?

We know his family, where did he get all this?

Those who knew him best understood him least

They lacked faith to allow God to work in their midst

They rejected him

And this lack of faith amazed Jesus

I see one common theme in our readings today

Those to whom the prophets were sent

All rejected them

**Ezekiel was rejected** 

Paul was rejected

Jesus was rejected

So if we are rejected when we speak the truth

At least we are in good company

That doesn't make it easy

**But Jesus tells us** 

The slave is not greater than the master

If they reject me

They will reject you

So why is it so difficult for us to listen?

Why is it so difficult for us to see and hear the truth?

I believe it is because the truth calls us out of ourselves

It calls us out of our comfort zone

It challenges us

It calls us to conversion

Often in areas we are very comfortable

Or in places in the heart we do not desire to go

Perhaps we are republican

And any republican is good enough for us

Or we are 3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> generation democrat

And any democrat will do

Even when the person running is opposed to our core values

Do we know our faith?

Can we give a defense for our beliefs?

Or are we Catholic because our parents and grandparents were?

Does being a Catholic mean anything?

Is being a Christian only a surface value in my life?

Are we seeking to be successful or faithful?

Are we willing to change?

Are we willing to enter into a conversion of heart?

Do we want to be guided by our faith or by our culture?

These are challenging, demanding times

Spiritually, politically and culturally

To prepare our hearts for these challenges

Our Holy Father has called for a Year of Faith

Beginning this October there will be a special focus on our faith lives

Opportunities for us to grow in our understanding

Opening the seed that was planted at our baptism

Centering our faith lives on the Eucharist

And bringing this new understanding

This new relationship with Christ into the world

There are so many people a priest or bishop can never touch

With whom we will never speak

But you can

We need to discover or rediscover the beautiful truths of our faith

And bring them into the world

We need to learn to be prophets

Not so we can be successful

But so we can be faithful
